



## **Standard Nomenclature for Seminole County Trails**

Based on the BCC approved Seminole County Trails and Greenways Master Plan, the 2000 Trails and Greenways Bond Referendum project list, and recent County Commissioner discussion, staff has created Exhibit A to indicate the current understanding of the nomenclature for the trails included in the current trails program. **Staff is requesting Board adoption of this nomenclature standard.**

### **Specialty Signage Standard      Exhibit B**

During development of the Seminole Wekiva Trail a concept was developed for specialty signage to be placed along the trail. This specialty signage includes primary identity signs for trailheads and other major features along the trail corridor, secondary identity signs which include a trail map (a.k.a. "You Are Here" signs), directional signs which indicate distances to key destinations, and mile markers. The concept implemented on the Seminole Wekiva Trail has also been utilized on the recently completed sections of the Cross Seminole Trail. **Staff is requesting adoption of this signage concept so that staff can continue to include it on upcoming construction projects, as well as to complete a retrofit of existing trails that have not utilized this standard.**


### **Retrofit of Non-standard Signage**

The signage concept described above was not developed until after the completion of the original section of the Cross Seminole Trail from SR 426 in Oviedo to Gardena Avenue in Winter Springs. Staff is making preparations to retrofit this section of trail and replace existing signs with the specialty signage concept as well as bring the regulatory ("Stop", "No Motor Vehicles", etc.) signs into compliance with the current Seminole County Trail standards. Based on the recent construction of the Cross Seminole Trail section from Gardena Avenue to Layer Elementary School the fabrication and installation of the signs to retrofit the original section of Cross Seminole Trail will cost approximately \$80,000. In addition, staff is making preparations to retrofit the Cross Seminole Trail from Greenway Boulevard to CR 46A (a.k.a the Crossings/Rinehart Road Trail) and install the specialty signage concept. The cost for this installation is estimated to be approximately \$25,000.

### **Information Kiosks      Exhibit C & D**

As the Seminole County trail system continues to expand and the numbers of trails users grow, it has become necessary to provide trail map signs ("You Are Here" signs) at more frequent intervals. Staff has determined that an additional 10 signs are needed along the Seminole Wekiva Trail and Cross Seminole Trail to better inform our citizens and trail users of the facilities available. In order to provide continual updates to the trail map as segments are completed, staff is recommending that kiosks be installed that allow maps to be replaced as they are updated, rather than install an expensive permanent map that may become obsolete in a short period of time. At this time staff is researching area vendors to determine what products are available locally that will meet our needs as well as to determine fabrication and installation costs. Preliminary estimates indicate that these kiosks may cost about \$5,000 each, for a total of \$50,000.

# SEMINOLE COUNTY GREENWAYS AND TRAILS

**RULES OF THE TRAIL**

- 1. Be courteous
- 2. Obey signs
- 3. Pass on the left
- 4. Give audible signals when passing
- 5. Travel in a predictable manner
- 6. Do not block the trail or roadway
- 7. Yield when entering or crossing the trail or roadway
- 8. Do not use the trail under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- 9. Clean up your litter
- 10. Keep pets on leashes
- 11. Motorized vehicles are prohibited and subject to citation
- 12. Do not feed wild animals
- 13. All children on bicycles under the age of 16 must wear a helmet or are subject to citation
- 14. Closed from dusk to dawn


