

MOTION/RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends adoption of a resolution recognizing Priority Healthcare Corporation as a "Qualified Targeted Industry" (QTI).							

BACKGROUND:

Currently headquartered in Lake Mary Technology Park, PHCC is a national specialty pharmacy and distributor that provides biopharmaceuticals, therapies, and related treatment programs and services to people with chronic disease. With anticipated revenues in 2003 are \$1.4 billion, Forbes Magazine ranked PHCC as one of the "200 Best Small Companies" in the nation. They currently employ 377 people at the facility in Lake Mary. PHCC will be adding 456 new jobs over a five year period paying an average salary of \$50,322.00/yr (or 150% of the county's average wage) by the end of 2009. With the additional jobs, PHCC will have a total of 833 employees.

The space to accommodate the increase in the number of jobs will be accomplished by expanding within the existing space. The proposal is to add an additional 55,000 sq ft to the current 67,000 sq ft they occupy bringing the total to 122,000 sq ft of space, most of which will be renovated to accommodate the expansion.

The Board of County Commissioners is being asked to consider a Qualified Target Industry Incentive (QTI) Award for PHCC. The total QTI award from the state is \$1,824,000. In accordance with the QTI program, local governments are required to provide a 20% match. The project is currently located within the City of Lake Mary. The match has historically been split by the impacted jurisdictions. Therefore, Seminole County and the City of Lake Mary will each be subject to half of the \$364,800. The County's portion of \$182,400.00 represents ½ of the required local 20% match. The other ½ of the local match will come from the City of Lake Mary.



Based on discussions with PHCC, they are also considering constructing, in Seminole County, a new facility in the future. In the event the project is constructed outside the City limits of Lake Mary, the attached resolution (Exhibit A) makes provision that the County will assume responsibility for the remaining QTI payments from that date forward. The phased payment schedule for the next eight years is shown in attached (Exhibit B) "Local Financial Support Template Calculation of Phased QTI Refunds." If, for example, PHCC moves to a new facility outside the City of Lake Mary at the conclusion of the 5 years, the remaining QTI payments for year 6 through 8 would be assumed by the County. In effect, that would add an additional \$64,900 to the County's obligation.

The return on investment (Exhibit C) is calculated at 3.3 years for all taxes countywide. Due to a 5 year job phase in schedule, the refund will be remitted over a 9 year period, not exceeding \$38,800 in any given year. According to the Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy individuals in Florida earning \$50,000 in 2003 pay an average of 8% of their salary to sales, excise and property taxes. (\$4000 X 456 = \$1.8 million) Additionally, the Florida Department of Revenue reports that individuals typically spend 50 to 55% of their personal income to buy taxable goods. (\$50,000 X 50% = \$25,000 X 456 = \$11.4 million in goods purchased). Attached is a summary of QTI projects previously approved by Seminole County involving leased space. (Exhibit D)

The project is consistent with stated economic development priorities of Seminole County in several respects;

- The project retains a headquarters company.
- The job creation is consistent with the development of high value added job opportunities within the county as stated in the JGI Ordinance, Section 1, (b).
- The project location and industry sector is consistent with the stated objectives of Seminole County's Economic Development Strategy, and the Metro Orlando EDC and Enterprise Florida Economic Development goals.

RESOLUTION NO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF SEMINOLE COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the business under consideration is a national specialty pharmacy and distributor, specifically, PRIORITY HEALTHCARE CORPORATION; and

WHEREAS, *Priority Healthcare Corporation* is located *at* 250 Technology Park, Suite 124 Lake Mary, FL 32746; and

WHEREAS, PRIORITY HEALTHCARE CORPORATION intends to expand their current existing operations from 67,000 sq ft to 122,000 sq ft and invest \$3 million in renovations and new equipment in addition to \$12 million in new software. The company plans to lease the new space for 7 – 10 years. If at the conclusion of their lease period, PHCC decides to relocate or build a new facility outside the City of Lake Mary corporate boundaries before the final QTI award has been distributed, Seminole County agrees to assume responsibility to payout the remainder of the local match including the City of Lake Mary portion; and

WHEREAS, Priority Healthcare Corporation will conservatively create 456 jobs, more than doubling their workforce, over a five year period beginning in 2005. These jobs will be professional and very specialized with an average salary of \$50,322; and

WHEREAS, It is acknowledged that local participation, of which Seminole County will provide 50% and the City of Lake Mary will provide 50% for a combined total of not to exceed \$364,800.00, is required and understood;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF SEMINOLE COUNTY, FLORIDA that the Board hereby recommends PRIORITY HEALTHCARE CORPORATION be approved as a Qualified Target Industry Business pursuant to S.288-106, Florida Statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the necessary commitment of local financial support for the Qualified Target industry Business for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program exists in an amount not to exceed \$364,800.00, that this amount will be paid to the Florida Economic Development Trust Fund as required, in accordance with the Office of Tourism, Trade and Economic Development guidelines, with the stipulation that these funds are intended to represent the "local participation" pursuant to S. 288-106, Florida Statutes.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
