2. Car Rental Surcharge – Support adoption of a new per diem charge as a local option (including a referendum requirement, if necessary, in order to secure passage of the bill).

Draft Language – Metro Plan – Currently seeking a sponsor for this bill. (Previously provided)

- Imposes a surcharge not to exceed \$2.00
- On Rental or leased agreements and apply on to the first thirty days.
- County may retain 3% of collections for Administrative Cost for record keeping requirements.
- Proceeds of the surcharge are limited to Funding transportation projects listed in the long range plan of the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the County.
- Requires all three Counties (Seminole, Orange, Osceola) to obtain approval by a referendum.
- 3. Support inclusion of a **Local Sources First Policy** in Florida Statutes, Chapter 373 Oppose any amendment to Florida's Water Resource Policy which allows, encourages, or promotes water transfers. Shell bills have recently been amended. (SB 440C1 Attachment A, HB 1881 Attachment B).

<u>S440C1 (Dockery)/H1881 (SRC) Water Supply, Planning, & Production</u>; creates provisions re water supply policy, planning, & production; provides for powers & duties of WMD governing boards; requires DEP to develop Florida water supply plan; provides legislative findings & intent re water resource development & water supply development & to alternative water supplies; requires WMDs to fund & implement said development; repeals provision re assistance to West Coast Regional Water Supply Authority, etc. Amends FS. C. **Growth Management** - Sen. Bennett has filed a shell bill (SB 360)
The proposal for the shell bill includes changes to Florida's growth management laws/rules. First, the Department of Community Affairs has issued two draft documents: one addressing general growth management issues under Ch. 163 and Rule 9J-5, while the other addresses changes in the Development of Regional Impact (DRI) process under Ch. 380, F.S.

The two latest draft growth management bills were provided via the internet. The first was the revision of DCA's original draft; the second was a proposed committee bill for the Senate Comprehensive Planning Committee and addresses local funding, and other issues. -SPB 7048

Rep. Carroll's bill on fire hydrants, as amended by our proposed language, (HB 267) passed unanimously out of the House Insurance Committee on February 22, 2005. (Bills previously provided). Representative Sorenson (R-Monroe County), Chair of the Local Government Council (LGC), is holding the bill and may not allow it to he heard by the LGC. Mssrs. Brantley and Thorn are working to overcome his objections to the bill.

F. Retirement/Emergency Dispatchers - Sen. Alexander filed <u>SB 1074</u> Companion Bill by Rep. Goldstein HB 693 which provides that emergency dispatchers and 911 operators employed by county or municipal law enforcement agency may participate as part of Special Risk Administrative Support Class and are eligible for special risk normal retirement date. Amends 121.0515.

The proposed amendment includes 911 Operators and Dispatchers in the Special Risk Category, but excluding other Public Safety 911 Operators and Dispatchers which creates an inequality in the system. It will negatively impact the County's efforts to maintain long term employees in the Emergency Communications Center, when they will be enticed to pursue employment with a law enforcement agency, and receive a better retirement rate. All qualifications being equal, it is recommended that the legislation include County and Municipal Public Safety (Fire and EMS) 911 Operators and Dispatchers. (Bill previously provided)

G. Local Govt. Land Dev./Impact Fees - H1173 GENERAL BILL by Clarke; (CO-SPONSORS) Planas; Rivera (Identical <u>S 2302</u>); provides legislative findings, declarations, & intent re local government impact fees; requires impact fees to be based upon certain available data; requires credit against impact fees for certain taxes, fees, assessments, liens, charges, or payments; specifies time period before collecting impact fee or fee increase; prohibits application of impact fee to certain building permits, etc. Creates 163.3219. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2005. (Bill previously provided)

Specifically, the bill:

- Limits how impact fees are calculated;
- · Limits how impact fees may be collected;
- Limits where impact fees may be expended;

- Limits who can receive a refund of unspent impact fees;
- Requires counties to wait six months between the imposition or increase in an impact fee and collection of the fees;
- Requires developers be given credits against the impact fee for the present value of all taxes, fees or other payments paid over a 30 year period (or 20 years under the House bill) indirectly or directly to fund the facilities, which is estimated to reduce impact fees by 30 percent;
- Has the effect of repealing all impact fee ordinances, as no impact fee ordinance currently complies with all the restrictions in the bill and there is no grandfather provision;
- Contains no replacement source of revenue for the reduced impact fees.
