BACKGROUND:

Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, which governs local planning, requires adoption of a progress report on all local comprehensive plans every seven years. The report is called the Evaluation and Appraisal Report, or "EAR". Seminole County's EAR was adopted by the Board of County Commissioners on August 8, 2006. The EAR was found to be 'sufficient' by the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) on October 16, 2006.

The sufficiency finding is the first step in a two-step process The next step is adoption of amendments to the Comprehensive Plan, based on the findings of the EAR. Normally, amendments must be adopted during a single amendment cycle within 18 months of the sufficiency finding. However, Seminole County requested and was granted a 6-month extension, in order to improve the coordination of land use and transportation planning policies. Accordingly, Seminole County's EAR-based amendments must be adopted by October 16, 2008.

In addition to the findings of the Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR), draft amendments are needed to address findings of studies accepted by the Board of County Commissioners in 2006. The studies include: US 17-92 CRA 2006 Corridor Strategy; Findings of the Seminole County Workforce Housing Task Force and the Seminole County 2006 Rural Character Plan. The amendments must also incorporate the principles of the Central Florida Regional Growth Vision ("How Shall We Grow?") and address the potential offered by the commuter rail project.

The Planning and Zoning Commission, in their role as Local/Land Planning Agency (LPA) has reviewed and commented on drafts of the elements at work sessions held on February 27th, March 5th, March 19th, April 2nd and April 16th. The first ten elements, which are attached as part of the exhibit to this agenda memorandum, include: Capital Improvements; Conservation; Design; Economic Development; Housing; Implementation; Introduction; Potable Water: Sanitary Sewer and Solid Waste.

The exhibit for each element includes: an Executive Summary with bulleted list of topic areas for which amendments are proposed; a Table of Major Changes, identifying text areas to be changed, why the change is proposed, and a very brief summary of the change; and the element itself, with changes shown in strike-through and underline format.
