Expansion Options



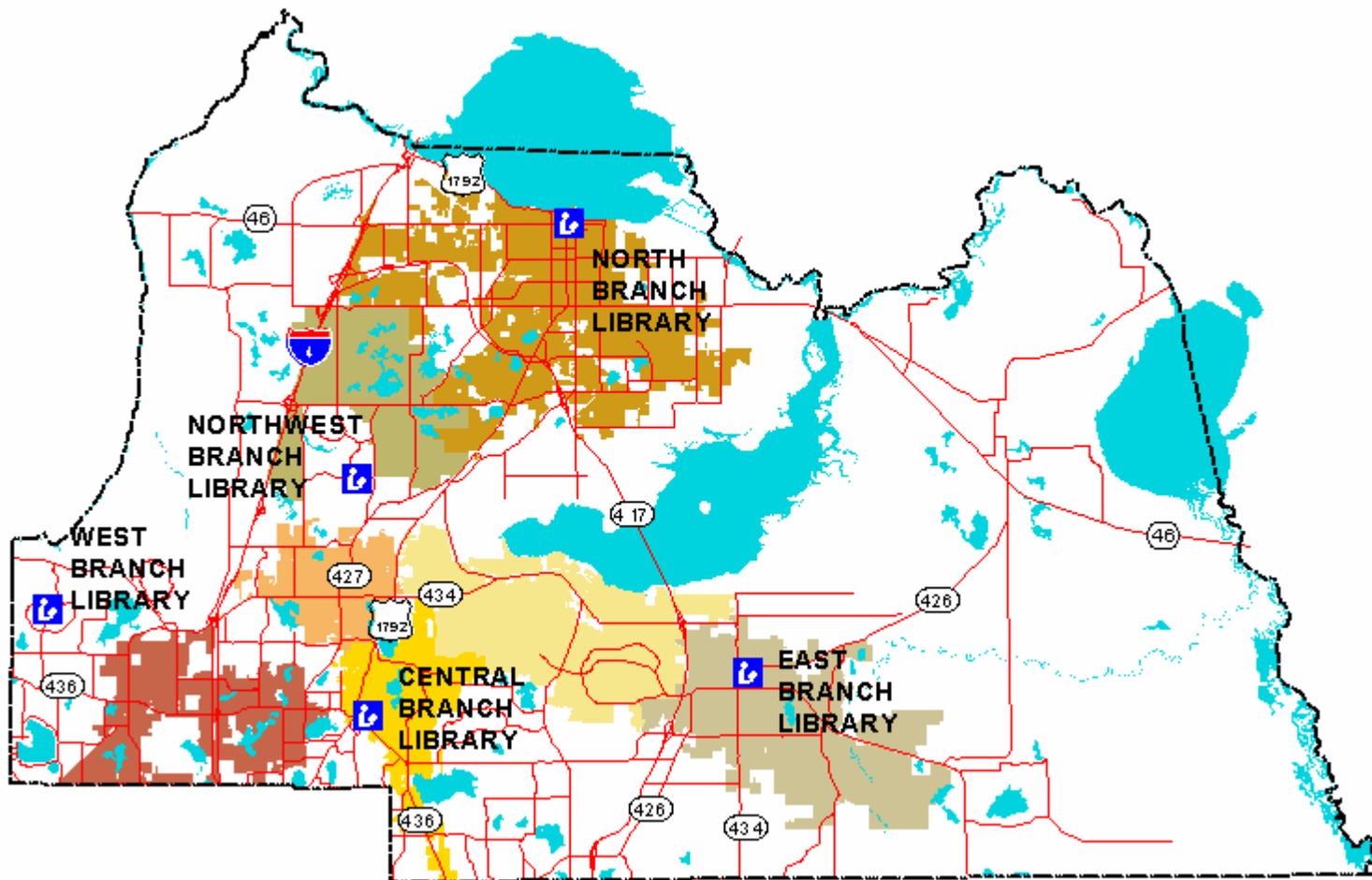


Seminole County Vision –

State Aid to Libraries requirements per Chapter 257, Florida Statutes

- Free lending of library materials;
 - Free provision of reference and information services;
 - Access to materials, information, and services for all residents;
 - At least one branch open 40 hours or more each week;
 - Long range plan adopted or approved by the library's governing body outlining the library's operation and development over a 3 – 5 year period. Update due September 2005.
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Services

- Current
 - Popular materials collection
 - Reference and nonfiction collection
 - AV – Spoken word only (audiocassettes and CD's)
 - Children's programming – birth through elementary school
- Requested by Residents – available in all other Central Florida counties
 - Full AV collection – DVD's/videos, music CD's
 - Teen areas and programming (Middle and High School)
 - Instructional computer labs
 - Additional meeting space
 - Study/tutoring rooms
 - Extensive outreach to children
 - Homework help programs

Option A

- Renovate Central Branch
- Renovate North Branch for administrative space
- 5 new 40,000 sq. ft. regional libraries
- Relocate East, North, Northwest, West branches
- New regional library in Winter Springs
- Offer requested services in all



Option B

- Renovate Central Branch
 - Renovate North Branch for administrative space
 - 5 new 32,000 sq. ft. regional libraries
 - Relocate East, North, Northwest, West branches
 - New regional library in Winter Springs
 - Offer current services only
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Option C

- Renovate Central Branch
- Renovate North Branch for administrative space
- 5 new 25,000 sq. ft. branches (phase 1)
- Offer current services only
- Plan site to expand buildings to 50,000 sq. ft. and parking from 125 to 250 spaces

Option D

- Existing branch libraries remain open as community libraries
- 2 new 50,000 sq. ft. regional libraries and renovated Central regional library
- Renovate existing 12,000 sq. ft. branches
- Build/rent/or renovate existing county-owned building 10,000 sq. ft. for library support operations
