To protect the public health and safety and protect the environment while providing quality, cost effective services to the citizens of Seminole County.


Current Economic Conditions

- Utilities are energy intensive enterprises
- Impacted by power and transportation costs
- System growth has moderated, will not support new programs
- Capital market conditions remain favorable
- Bidding environment remains favorable

2009 Budget Performance Water and Sewer

- Base flows and revenues continue at 2009 levels
- 2010 operating budget for W&S is \$209K (0.8%) less than 2009 for existing programs

Full Review of W/S Capital Program Needs

- Reprioritize Most Critical Needs
- Move the Most Critical, Regulatory Driven Projects
 Forward
- Defer Less Urgent Regulatory Projects

Reprioritization Results:

- Tier I: Urgent
- Tier II: Need Within 3 Years (FY10-12)
- Tier III: Need Within 5 Years (FY12-15)
- Clearly Defined, Time Driven...Manage Risk Over Time

90% of all CIP projects are regulatory driven

CIP Budget Status

- \$61M Water & Sewer CIP Funding Available
 - Will Fund 1/2 of Tier I Projects
- \$92M Additional Water & Sewer CIP Funding Needed to Support FY10 and FY11 Projects
 - FY10 Borrowing Need is \$70M
 - Will Fund Remaining Tier I & 2/3 of Tier II Projects
- \$58M Additional Funding Needed After 2011
 - To Support Remaining Tier II & Tier III Projects
 - Does Not Include Yankee Lake Potable Surface Water Supply Project

Urgency of Need

- Long Term Rate Impacts Identified in 2006
- 18% anticipated for FY09
- Rate Adjustment Needed Now for Existing Debt Service Coverage
- Projects Deferred Pending Bond Decision




Rate Comparisons/FY 2009 Bills

(10,000 gal/mo Average Bill)




Rate Comparisons/FY 2010 Bills
