MOTION/RECOMMENDATION: Reappoint Commissioner Art Woodruff, City of Sanford, as a Municipal Representative to serve on the Seminole County Expressway Authority, pursuant to unanimous recommendation of the seven (7) cities.

BACKGROUND:
The State Statute establishing the Seminole County Expressway Authority (SCEA) provides that five (5) County Commissioners and two (2) elected municipal officials within the County serve as Authority members.
The term of one of the municipal positions, held by Commissioner Art Woodruff, from the City of Sanford, expires in January 2005. Commissioner Woodruff has served one (1) term on the Authority and expressed willingness to be reappointed.
Historically, the Council of Local Governments (CALNO) has served as a forum for recommending municipal representatives to serve on the Expressway Authority. At their November 3, 2004 meeting, CALNO voted to recommend Commissioner Art Woodruff, from the City of Sanford, for reappointment.
After CALNO's action, each city was asked to endorse CALNO's recommendation by placing the matter before their respective City Commission for official action. As a result, each of the seven cities has endorsed CALNO's recommendation to reappoint Commissioner Art Woodruff to the Seminole County Expressway Authority Board.

Pending the County Commission's December 14, 2004, approval, and subject to the statutory requirement of being an elected municipal official, Mr. Woodruff's term will run

Re: Seminole County Expressway Authority – Municipal Appointment Commissioner Art Woodruff's Term on the SCEA Board

Dear Commissioner Brender:

The State Statute establishing the Seminole County Expressway Authority provides that the five (5) County Commissioners and two (2) elected municipal officials within the County serve as Authority members. The Statute also provides that the Board of County Commissioners select the municipal members unless twothirds of the municipalities jointly recommend in writing to the County Commission their selection of a member for appointment within thirty (30) days of a vacancy occurring.

The completion of the two-year term of the municipal position held by Sanford City Commissioner, Art Woodruff, is now upon us. Said term began in January 2003 and ends in January 2005. Commissioner Woodruff has expressed his willingness to be reappointed.

Historically, the Council of Local Governments (CALNO) has served as a forum for recommending municipal representatives to serve on the Expressway Authority. It will be most helpful if CALNO will continue to assist in the process and place this matter on its November meeting agenda.

After CALNO's action, each of the seven cities will need to endorse CALNO's recommendation by placing the matter before their respective City Commission for official action, and advising Seminole County of the action taken.

Because of the requirements of Chapter 348, Florida Statutes, CALNO's recommendation needs to be affirmed by a majority of the municipalities and approved by the Seminole County Board of County Commissioners (BCC). We anticipate placing this matter on the BCC agenda for December 14, 2004. In order to meet BCC agenda submittal requirements, we respectfully request receipt of CALNO's recommendation and each city's letter endorsing CALNO's recommendation by November 29, 2004. By copy of this letter, we are advising each City Manager of this schedule.

We look forward to receiving CALNO's recommendation and the municipal endorsements. Thereafter we plan on forwarding same to the County Commission for action at the December 14, 2004, meeting.
