The information included in this Addendum revises, clarifies, or supplements the specifications and other provisions of the contract documents and is considered part and parcel to the RFP/BID Package.

Bid Security for this project shall be in the amount of five thousand and 00/100 dollars (\$5,000).

The following questions were received from Synagro Technologies, Inc.:

1. Section 5. What records do you expect to be covered by the Section 5 five-year record retention requirement?

RESPONSE: Refer to Section 5, paragraph (b) for detailed record retention.

2. Section 13. What is meant by the phrase "whether caused by the CONTRACTOR or otherwise"? Do you expect the CONTRACTOR to indemnify an indemnified party to the extent it may have also contributed to the loss? Would you consider adding the following:

Nothing in this Agreement shall obligate Contractor to indemnify or hold harmless any individual or entity from and against the consequences of that individual's or entity's own negligence or willful conduct?

RESPONSE: Indemnification may be negotiated upon notification of award.

3. Section 14.(a) (1). As insurance is often negotiated for the best pricing until the date of renewal, is it possible that the County would consider rewording the 30 day requirement to be that they would receive the new certificate within 48 hours of the renewal date?

RESPONSE: No.

4. Section 14.(a)(3). As many policies contain non-public information, if the County requests a copy of the policy, will it be amenable to signing a non-disclosure agreement to maintain the confidentiality of the information.

RESPONSE: Such an agreement would be unnecessary, as only information that is subject to disclosure under the Public Records Act is made open to the public by Seminole County.

5. Section 14. (c)(3) What profession will be covered by the requirement of "Professional Liability insurance"? What specific kind of policy is expected?

RESPONSE: This is an errors and omissions policy covering all employees, including owners and officers.

6. What license is required of the Contractor, if any?

RESPONSE: Class A CDL with tanker endorsements.

7. What registration or certification is meant by that referred to on page 5 under Licenses and Permits of the Terms and Conditions?

RESPONSE: Contact the State of Florida, Department of Professional Regulations for requirements in Leachate Hauling.

Failure to acknowledge receipt of this addendum on the submittal may result in disqualification of your bid response.
