NEW BUSINESS:

- Blueways Preliminary discussions regarding the St. Johns River Brief Seminole County synopsis was given by Trails & Parks Coordinator Grant Wenrick. The primary goal was to glean preliminary input for Blueways along the St. Johns River. This plan will be developed over the next 1 to 2 years and evolve thereafter.
 - St. Johns Recreational Boating Map / Aerial 30"x42" aerials were put up that depicted the entire Seminole County and adjacent Volusia County. The maps depicted all or most known dedicated recreational facilities along both sides of the river. The map also depicted all the built and planned trails as a reference.
 - 11"x17" Maps Were also handed out at the meeting.
- Volusia County Input By Tim Baylie and Bruce Piatek.
 - Work together Provide collaboration where appropriate for blueway routes & recreation opportunities.
 - Trails Working to connect Spring to Spring Trail to Sunrail. Current trail gaps being filled in by I-4.

- Current Blueways & Planning Efforts Hontoon Island, Hickory Bluff but with limited access, Deep Creek with substantial hike on hold until trail can be developed, Mariner's Cove has new launch, Ed Stone Park Deland area, Gemini Springs getting dedicated launch ramp and part time rental, looking at improvements at Beck Ranch and long range connection to Silver Glen Springs near the Ocala National Forest.
- Funding Utilizing Boater Improvement Funds and Grants where possible.
- City of Sanford Input By Chris Smith and Marc Holtin
 - Good Location Biggest City along the St. John within Seminole. 5
 miles of shoreline. Lake generally 6-7 feet deep. Wants to capitalize on
 waterfront. Zoo working to make entrance more prominent and safe
 connection across 17-92 for future trail. Jacksonville Zoo has mooring
 places for boaters and personal watercraft.
 - Trails & Recreation Connections Phase 2 of Riverwalk under construction to hospital. Looking to expand Canoe & Kayak launch opportunity at NE side of Marina peninsula. Working to get sailboat regatta back. Potential larger boat mooring pier to east of marina. Seminole designing Riverwalk / Mellonville / Celery to SR 415 trail now. Wants to connect trail to west over 17-92 to Volusia's Trails.
 - o **Funding –** Have worked with MPO for grants in past.
- St. Johns River Alliance By Andrea Conover and Mark Middlebrook
 - Non-Profit Advocacy Group Mainly dedicated to providing river information along the entire length. Broke river down into 23 segments with vital stopping points, parks, marinas, points of interest etc. Segment list up and running but not the maps. Working to get better GIS maps on their website. OGT Office of Greenways & Trails advised to try to pattern after the Applachicola River. OGT may help with maps.
 - Other Maps Recommended Kingfisher SJR. National Geographic for the Suwanee River Blueway.
 - Funding SJRA License Plate, donations, working to produce a book for pay navigational aid.
 - Other Seminole's Black Bear has 1 primitive campsite and a canoe/kayak dock.
 - Working together As stated by Seminole and Volusia County there is a common desire to not duplicate any mapping efforts.
